

NEW TESTAMENT LESSON

Mark 6:14-29

¹⁴King Herod heard of it, for Jesus' name had become known.
Some were saying, "John the baptizer has been raised from the dead;
and for this reason these powers are at work in him."

¹⁵But others said, "It is Elijah." And others said,
"It is a prophet, like one of the prophets of old."

¹⁶But when Herod heard of it, he said,
"John, whom I beheaded, has been raised."

¹⁷For Herod himself had sent men who arrested John, bound him,
and put him in prison on account of Herodias,
his brother Philip's wife, because Herod had married her.




Gradually increasing tempo can heighten the sense of joy and power in this psalm.




