AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

*(from *Belonging to God: A First Catechism, PC(USA) 1998*)*

Who are you? I am a child of God.

What does it mean to be a child of God? That I belong to God, who loves me.

What makes you a child of God? Grace: God's free gift of love that I do not deserve and cannot earn.

Don't you have to be good for God to love you? No. God loves me in spite of all I do wrong.

Why do we pray "Give us today our daily bread"? Because all good things come from God. Even in our most ordinary needs, God cares for us completely.

Why does our prayer end with "Amen"? "Amen" means "so be it" or "let it be so." It expresses our complete confidence in God, who makes no promise that will not be kept and whose love endures forever.
