The first movement of Mendelssohn's third organ sonata is based on the chorale AUS TIEFER NOT. The middle section of the movement is a brilliant double fugue, under which you will hear the chorale melody in the pedals. This fugue is sandwiched by two stunning Maestoso sections in A Major, each with a trumpet call reminiscent of the opening phrase of the chorale, "Out of the depths I cry to you."
