O FILII ET FILIAE employs a unique form – it opens with an Alleluia section, and then ends each verse with the last two of those Alleluias. However, the repeat sign does not appear at the beginning; each verse begins on the second line. Sung liturgy is often closely associated with texts like the Kyrie (Lord, have mercy) or Gloria (Glory to God in the highest), but here we also use excerpts from hymns as hymn responses each week. They usually change for specific seasons or sometimes by month. Today, you will find the same sung responses from Easter Sunday a few weeks ago; these will continue until Pentecost Sunday, May 20.



The collection today will help provide grants to hunger agencies in our Presbytery and is one way to make a difference in the lives of those who struggle with food insecurity.

William Batchelder Bradbury composed the tunes for Hymn 187 and the Offertory selection. The texts associated with these melodies both refer to shepherding and leading. Bradbury wrote many tunes intended for children, the most recognizable, perhaps, being *Jesus Loves Me*! *Response Hymn 239- stanza 1 Good Christians all, rejoice and sing! Now is the triumph of our King! To all the world glad news we bring: Alleluia! Alleluia!
