Today we celebrate the Lord's Supper, one of the sacraments of our faith. In the Presbyterian Church we practice an "open table." This means that people who trust in Jesus Christ are welcome to take part in the Lord's supper.

Our hymn texts today focus on how Christ unifies us: all are bound together, all are blessed, and all can be a blessing to others.

Our confession today helps us to admit that sometimes our partiality blinds us to all of God's possibilities. What partialities have limited your vision for who God is and for what graces God would have you see and experience?

Psalm 98 is one of the most beloved of all the Psalms. It is the source for many hymns and songs of praise: most famously the Christmas carol "Joy to the World." As you listen to Psalm 98, tune your ears to the music in the text and to its calls to sing praises to our God of righteousness and equity.

We continue our readings in Acts this week with one of Peter's most famous sermons. In this excerpt take note of the radical proposition which Peter is suggesting: in a deeply partial and divided time, Peter is calling his hearers to show no partialities among themselves. This is one of the most powerful sermons in the entire New Testament.

The Apostles' Creed dates to the earliest days of the church itself. It is an ancient creed translated into English from ancient languages. While it has been amended and updated over the centuries, our current version dates from the late middle ages. As we say it together, we are both remembering who Christians have been in the past and carrying our living faith for the times in which we live.
