Pentecost Offering Today: The Presbyterian Church (USA) has four denominational offerings each year. Today we will collect the Pentecost Offering. The seasons and celebrations from the beginning of the Christian Year (Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Baptism of the Lord, Transfiguration Sunday, Ash Wednesday, Lent, Easter, and Sundays after Easter) mark the life and ministry of Christ-that's roughly half of the calendar year: December thru May. Today, the Day of Pentecost, with the gift of the Holy Spirit, celebrates the birth of the Christian Church; and the season of Pentecost, or Ordinary Time/Sundays after Pentecost, marks the life and ministry of the church/the Body of Christ-that's roughly the other half of the calendar year: June thru November. Also, the congregation of White Memorial Presbyterian began on Pentecost Sunday 72 years ago. Happy Birthday, indeed!

We carry the light of the Christ candle out into the world at the conclusion of worship: this idea of proclaiming the good news to the world is represented by the light carried out by our service assistants. The long season of 'Sundays after Pentecost' acknowledges the life and growth of the church. The symbol of the Christ Candle returns to santuary worship for the seasons of Advent-Christmas-Epiphany and Lent-Easter-Eastertide when the focus is on the life of Christ: his birth, ministry, teaching, passion and resurrection.
