





In the presence of the Holy Spirit, the first Christians experienced God's own presence, not a power different from God or less than God. In Jesus Christ they met God, not a second God or one who is only like God. Yet they worshiped with the people of Israel one God alone. Reflecting on this mystery, the ancient church formulated the doctrine of the Trinity. We believe with the church through the centuries that God is who is revealed in the story of God's people; One God who is the Creator and Sustainer, the Savior and Lord, the Giver of life within, among and beyond us. We affirm the richness and variety in God's being and work. We may not separate the work of God as Creator from the work of God as Redeemer. We may not set the Son's love against the Father's justice. We may not value the Holy Spirit's work above the work of the Father and Son. The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit are one God in eternal being and activity.
