Iglesia Santuario is a new worshiping community of New Hope Presbytery that reaches out to the Hispanic population of Raleigh and Wake County to build a space for God's worship and service. Santuario is working with Presbytery's Church Development & Evangelism Committee to be chartered as a congregation of the Presbyterian Church (USA) in the coming years. With average Sunday worship attendance of 70, their ministry focuses on outreach to the community through sports, particularly soccer and volleyball, Christian education, and service through the Salvation Army and Habitat for Humanity. WMPC has supported Santuario through its outreach budget for the past two years and our two congregations partner on joint Habitat projects.

Each Sunday, we offer four opportunities for you to worship with us at White Memorial (8:15, 9:30 and 11:00 a.m. in the Sanctuary and 11:00 a.m. On Point@1704 in Pickard Hall). While you will notice differences in music, location and worship leadership among our different services, what unites us in our worship is our liturgy. All services use the same Call to Worship, Prayer of Confession, readings from scripture and Affirmation of Faith.



# WIDOWS OF WHITE MEMORIAL


