Each Sunday, we offer four opportunities for you to worship with us at White Memorial (8:15, 9:30 and 11:00 a.m. in the Sanctuary and 11:00 a.m. OnPoint@1704 in Pickard Hall). While you will notice differences in music, location and worship leadership among our different services, what unites us in our worship is our liturgy. All services use the same Call to Worship, Prayer of Confession, readings from scripture and Affirmation of Faith.

J. S. Bach was one of the first composers to write a set of 24 preludes and fugues, one in each key, for keyboard. In fact, he wrote 48 preludes and fugues and split them into two books, known as the Well-Tempered Clavier. Well-Tempered was the new tuning system at the time that allowed keyboardists to play in all major and minor keys, and Clavier is the German word for keyboard. This Prelude in E-Flat Major comes from the second book, and features a lilting style in triple meter. These works are most often played on the piano now, but it is worth noting that the modern piano did not exist when these works were

We call ourselves to worship with a petition to the Holy Spirit. In theology, a petition is a request made to God.

While there is no earth-shaking difference between a prayer of confession and an act of confession, today's confession is an act. Think of it as an action of the entire congregation which then leads us into the prayer. This action, or act, of confession embodies our life as a covenant community bound by the promises and callings of God.

The passing of peace is among the oldest of Christian traditions and practices of worship. It is an activity of welcome, hospitality, and mutual blessing.

Many hymns are reflections upon scripture. This hymn is an exact quotation of Micah 6:8. Micah is one of the prophets of the Old Testament. Micah means, "who is like God?"

Psalm 1 is not only the beginning of the book of Psalms. it is also a "stage setter" as it calls us to consider the delight of the law and word of God. After Psalm 1, the following 149 Psalms each do their part to describe how God's law and word shape our lives.

A modern hymn, The Servant Song is growing in its familiarity and usage. As you sing it we hope you will begin to understand its growth. Listen to its "words of calling" - calling to faith, calling to joy, and calling to service.

In the last line the Confession guides us to say that to live and to serve is to confess our faith in Christ. This statement is a beautiful reminder that our actions in service to Jesus are as important as the words we say about him.

A toccata is a work that is frequently fast and flourishing. The Italian root of the word is "toccare", to touch; hence a composition with rapid passages or fast moving notes. The title, Toccata, has been used for pieces since the early 16th century, with a variety of forms over five centuries. Living British composer J. Rutter gives us a modern Toccata in which he employs the mixed meter of 7/8—you will notice this "uneven" feeling in the opening and closing sections.


