Saints' days began as a way to mark the anniversaries of the death of the martyrs, those who gave their lives for their beliefs. After a while there were too many Saints' days to remember them all. Around the first millennium the church dedicated the Sunday closest to November 1 as a time to honor all the Saints. In our Reformed tradition the emphasis of this festival is on the ongoing sanctification of the whole people of God. We give thanks for the Saints of the past and for the holy lives of believers in this and in every age. This is a special time to remember and give thanks for those who have died this past year. The liturgical color for All Saint's Day is white.



The baptism of children is a clear sign that God out of God's grace has taken initiative for our salvation. When we bring our children for baptism we promise to raise them in the faith. The congregation makes promises to support the care and nurture of each child that is baptized. This includes volunteering in the nursery, teaching Sunday School, supporting mission trips and summer camps, as well as any other of ways that we can encourage our young people to know that they are loved by us and by God.

WMPC pastors shared their thoughts on including the psalms in weekly worship: "The psalms express the true feelings of the people of God, and they remind us that it is okay to be honest with God about our true feelings." "We need to experience – face to face – the larger truth that the story of our lives is not just about us and our own experience – it is about the intervention and grace of God – so much bigger, so much more powerful and reassuring than any of the self-made notions of our lives."

On World Communion Sunday we celebrate the sacrament with attention to a global community of faith. On "All Saints' Sunday" we remember that each Lord's Supper unites us across time as well as space as we celebrate a communion with all the saints before us.

#### **Generosity Campaign 2019 Update**

As of Wednesday, October 31, we have received 521 pledges totaling \$2,391,770. Thank you for your support of the ministry of White Memorial Presbyterian Church.

The word "Helvetic" is Latin for "Swiss." The setting of the Second Helvetic Confession is Swiss-German Reformed Protestantism.

Reflecting the theological maturity of the Reformed churches this confession is moderate in tone and universal in spirit. It was written in 1561 by Heinrich Bullinger and he intended the document to be attached to his last will and testament to the Zurich church. The churches of Switzerland adopted Bullinger's confession and soon after this it received wide acceptance throughout Europe and beyond.

The Second Helvetic Confession emphasizes the church and its life and affirms the authority of Scriptures for the church's governance and reformation. It also addresses the practical life of the gathered community.

The hymn tune *MISSISSIPPI* is the basis of the music for both the Prelude and the Postlude today. The hymn (not in *Glory to God*) will be sung at our annual memorial Evensong service this afternoon at 4:00. Please join us for this service of remembrance as combined choirs and guest harpist, Anita Burroughs-Price offer musical meditations, along with scripture, prayers, a homily and necrology.

Each Sunday, we offer four opportunities for you to worship with us at White Memorial (8:15, 9:30 and 11:00 a.m. in the Sanctuary and 11:00 a.m. OnPoint@1704 in Pickard Hall). While you will notice differences in music, location and worship leadership among our different services, what unites us in our worship is our liturgy. All services use the same Call to Worship, Prayer of Confession, readings from scripture and Affirmation of Faith.

We have shared many wonderfully sacred times of life: happy times as we have celebrated births, baptisms, confirmations, graduations, and marriages; and the sad times as we faced illnesses, crises, and deaths of loved ones. My thoughts of our time together bring me joy and much gratitude. At the same time, I am sad to be leaving you and White Memorial.

In making the transition, effective November 15 I will be reducing my hours and concentrating most of my time on the building project to make sure it starts off on a good foundation. 




