

The text and the music of "O come, O come, Emmanuel" developed separately. The tune VENI EMMANUEL (Emmanuel=God with us) was first linked with this hymn in 1851, when Thomas Helmore published it in the Hymnal Noted and is most familiar in the English-speaking world with its origins in 15th-century France. The Latin text, dating back 1,200 years to 9th-century monastic life, is first documented in Germany in 1710.




