

Every version stems from the same source and is inspired by Luke 2:6-20. This hymn was published in North America in *Nouveau recueil de cantiques* (New Hymnal) for the Diocese of Quebec in 1819. The original hymn appeared in French – *Les anges dans nos campagnes* – as a traditional French carol that originated as early as the 18th century. The English translation was done by James Chadwick (1813-1882), Roman Catholic Bishop of Hexham and Newcastle.


