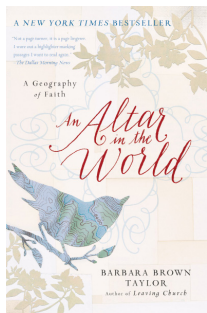
CANCER COMPANIONS MINISTRY
