Today we will hear the story of Zacchaeus. Most of Luke is mirrored in either Matthew or Mark. Zacchaeus only appears in Luke. Whenever an episode is free standing in scripture, it is a good time to pay extra attention. All scripture is important and beloved. But stories like this one, because of their rarity, are always worth a deeper look.

Throughout the church’s history, liturgy (form and order in which worship is conducted) has been both sung and spoken. Our communion liturgy features both sung and spoken elements.

In the Presbyterian Church (USA) we invite worshipers to an “open table.” No matter your Christian tradition, all who are baptized and who trust in Jesus are invited to share communion with us.

This is taken from a study catechism. Catechisms are an ancient practice for Christian formation. Written in question and answer form, they explain Christian belief and teach the faith by drawing from the witness of the confessions of the church and upon the Bible itself.
