

This setting of Psalm 46 uses *Glory* to *God* Hymn 414 as a refrain, sung between verses that will be led by a cantor.

Our text from Luke is the song of Zechariah. Zechariah was the father of John the Baptist, who came to prepare the way for Jesus in the world. This text is both a bridge to Advent and a foreshadowing of the grace that Jesus will offer to the world itself. *Offertory Response Hymn 643 - stanza 3 NUN DANKET ALLE GOTT All praise and thanks to God, who reigns in highest heaven, to Father and to Son and Spirit now be given: the one eternal God, whom heaven and earth adore, the God who was, and is, and shall be evermore.


