Seventh week of Easter



"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

The celebration continues

With these words of Jesus (Acts 1:8), the first disciples learned that Easter was not the end, but the beginning. Good news kite

Supplies: Paper grocery bag; string; hole punch; felt-tip markers.

To celebrate Jesus' ascension, spend an afternoon flying kites.

A simple kite can be made from a large grocery sack. Punch holes in the four corners at the top of the bag.

Attach 18" long strings to each corner and knot the strings together. Tie a long string to the knot for flying. Decorate the bag with designs and words that proclaim the Easter gospel and send the message aloft. Note: The kite works best if the kite flyer is running with it!
