Friday to Sunday

As I write these words there is not a preponderance of good news to be found. There are pockets here and there, but we are in the first weeks of what is sure to be a long period of isolation. A time of pandemic and challenge that we are not soon to forget.

As I have said before, to the ancient Greeks Chronos was a titan (think: chronology. Time was one of the fundamental forces which held the universe together. Meaning it couldn't be stopped. Not even a virus, a really bad pandemic-level virus, can stop the turning of the hands of the clock or the pages of the calendar. Pandemic or not, Holy Week is coming. Virus or not, April 12 will still be Easter. Even the pathogens must bow down to the power of time.

This confronts us with a question: how does one witness to Easter in the midst of a "stay at home" order? How do you do Easter in a pandemic? Well, to be direct no one has had to ask the question for more than 100 years since the last really big pandemic in 1918. But, remember the lesson of time: know what to do or have no idea what to do, the clock is ticking. Easter is coming.

Perhaps the most famous sermon in American History not preached by Martin Luther King, Jr. or Billy Graham but was preached by the Californian S.M. Lockridge (at least we think it was Rev. Lockridge as so many have repeated his words, he is our best candidate for the original author). The sermon he preached had the amazing and often repeated refrain, "It's Friday now, but Sunday's coming."

On Good Friday, all seemed lost. Jesus died. The Roman cross won. It was finished. Friday was a bad day, a symbol for tough times, hardship, mourning, and sorrow.

On Sunday everything changs. Three days later, lament has given way to a miracle. The sun breaks the eastern horizon, and Friday's from the past have given way to Sunday's of the future. God's power is made known in the wonder and grace of Easter, and it shall be made known on every Sunday as far as we might see. Jesus' triumph over death has changed all things.

"It's Friday now, but Sunday's coming."

One can see why it is a famous sermon. It captures the grief-tinged cliffhanger of Good Friday, the wonder of God's power on Easter Sunday, and the call to hopeful expectation which every soul requires in a handful of words. It portrays the truth and strength of our faith with a phrase that is both easy to remember and profound in its possibility.

If you are doing what you can to endure long days of limited freedom, you are a "Sunday person." If you are doing what you can to help a neighbor who cannot get out, checking on a elderly relative, looking in on a cousin who has had many health care problems, then you are a "Sunday person." If you are praying for the world, praying for our health care teams, praying for researchers and virologists, reading your Bible, or doing online devotions then you are a "Sunday person." And if you are, because of fear or circumstance, stuck on Friday as you read these words, then please close your eyes and clench your fists and say out loud, "Sunday's coming."

Easter comes on God's time. And while Easter 2020 will look and feel different, and while we will still be "together, apart," it will still be Easter. Wherever there is Easter, there is yet cause for hope. Thanks be to God for that.


PALM SUNDAY PALMS

CHILDREN'S CHOIRS

- Children's choirs have been receiving weekly "at-home" singing and music resources including solfege
 exercises, links to anthems and hymns for singing along at home, as well as an invitation to send videos
 of themselves in a virtual show and tell of singing, playing instruments, or spoken well wishes to their choir
 friends.
- **Joyful Noise choir** had a Zoom check-in last Wednesday. They will plan to do this every other week for those who wish to join.
- Lee Baker, volunteer Carol Choir director, is planning a zoom check-in for the Carol Choir.
- Youth Choir has been receiving weekly music resources for singing at home including recordings/videos of
 anthems we've sung this year and in years past. They had a Zoom check-in two Sundays ago and will plan to
 do one every other week. This past Friday, youth singers were invited to watch a Facebook Live of
 composer Mark Miller's page where he shared music (some of which we've sung at WMPC) and words of
 hope and encouragement.
- Kirsten Homdrom, Associate Music Director, has been reaching out to individual families in the **Joyful Noise Choir** via email, and Kelly Gold, Director of Children's and Youth Music, is currently working on sending **Youth Choir** members hand written notes to let them know they are thinking of them.

OUTREACH IS IN TOUCH

We have received great words of personal encouragement from our mission partners in Poland and Russia. They are experiencing the same health issues that we are, but we have communicated with one another and share our thoughts.

Locally, most of our community partners have had to close their facilities in the last several weeks. It has been interesting to see the ways they have been able to keep in touch with their program participants. Those that house individuals and families have a lock down policy, so they are dealing with new challenges. Our agencies that work with the food insecure have done all they can safely do to make meals and food available. Since many who normally get meals from the soup kitchen are having to stay in place, they have seen a decrease in the total number of meals served, but the meal demand is strong among restaurant workers who have lost jobs.

The main focus of outreach over the last several weeks has been to provide basic necessities such as food and the cleaning supplies we have been able to secure. We will continue to work with the larger organizations that

are maintaining operations to provide food, but we have also been focusing effort in our local Mayview/ Oberlin Road Community. We are doing what we can to restock the food pantry at Wilson Temple UMC and working with churches along Oberlin Road to be a weekend meal drop off site for the government children's school lunch program. We help facilitate the distribution of 150 meals between 12:00 and 1:00 pm on Saturday and Sunday.

Our Outreach team communicates constantly to see what needs there are and tries to meet them as safely as we can. With the wonderful financial response by the congregation we are able to quickly distribute funds where needed. The food donations in the bins in front of Witherspoon have been steady and have been delivered to several sites in the community. We are currently asking only for food and cleaning supplies. Other donations will resume when our facility reopens. Many places are unable to receive other donations because of closing or lack of staff, and we are trying to keep our members safe by not being out any more than is necessary.
