"The only thing that counts...."

Last summer we were preaching our way through the dozens and dozens of "one another" texts of the Bible. The most famous "one another" is in the gospel of John, when Jesus says: "you shall love one another as I have loved you." Near the end of June, I preached on Galatians 5. I took it on as a challenge as my text was Galatians 5, verse 13, among the most difficult of the bunch: "through love become slaves to one another." In preparing the sermon, my eyes were continually drawn instead to Galatians 5, verse 6. It leaped off the page for me, as though I saw it for the first time: "the only thing that counts is faith working through love."

In June 2020 we are striving to adapt to new restrictions and limits that have been placed on our lives by an earthquake in the form of a novel pathogen. It is becoming better known to us each day, creeping a little deeper into our lives and consciousnesses. It appears to be the next in a line of threats that we must confront with courage, knowledge, and wisdom. The 19th-century hymn God of the Ages Whose Almighty Hand captures the spirit of the prayer we pray: "From wars alarms, from deadly pestilence; be thy strong arm our ever sure defense. Be thou our ruler, guardian, guide, and stay: thy word our law, thy paths our chosen way."

Faith, the Bible tells us, is the assurance of what is hoped for and the conviction of things not seen. Faith in God and trust in the arc of history means that we believe that in God's calculus what we hope for and cannot see is that which shall come to pass. This kind of belief can appear at first glance to be naive. But the truth is that such faith requires courage. The truth is that it is anything but naive as the long march of time has proven repeatedly that God, even while at times mysterious, is alone worthy of our future hopes.

The question is, what to do until then? What to do until the days of our living seem safer and more secure? The answer for us, the followers of Jesus, is found at Galatians 5, verse 6: "the only thing that counts is faith working through love." Until we know the specifics of what the future may hold, such aspirations for faith and love must be our guide. Thankfully, our memories and stories are full of testimony for how true a guide faith and love have been, can be, and will be.

Our Session and ReOpening Task Group are constantly monitoring guidance from health officials, best practices as shared by medical professionals, and the best wisdom from other pastors and churches near and far. We are working and praying daily about the summer and fall weeks to come, relative to our church campus. Once again, I ask you to keep the leaders of our church in prayer. Please check the website and read your weekly email from the church for details about activities and worship at WMPC.
- 2. In this monthly newsletter, our Executive Director, Andrew Amodei, will provide a more detailed update on our building project. The building phase will be complete this month. To date, the project is on budget. I am happy to report that pledges to the project will cover the balance of building expenses and provide the balance of our Imagine Fund, which is a long-term endowment dedicated to benevolences and facilities upkeep. I ask you to continue your incredible support and generosity so we can see this transformational project to its end.
- 3. Finally, I want to commend our "faith at home" efforts to you. On our website you will find devotionals, contemplative practices, offerings from our music staff, a sermon archive, and cooking tips from Macy Aguirre, our Director of Food Services. I hope you are taking the time to use this valuable resource.

PHILIPPIANS SUMMER PREACHING SERIES: JOY AND CONFIDENCE TO SPARE

The book of Philippians occupies a special place in the hearts of people who love the New Testament. While not the longest letter of Paul, or technically speaking, his most complete letter, it is nonetheless the most beloved. Its verses are among the most hopeful, joyful, and quotable lines in all the Bible.

From its very beginning, at chapter 1 verse 3 where Paul begins, "I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you," the letter builds promise upon promise and joy upon joy throughout its four concise chapters. When we consider that Paul is believed to have been facing real and deep hardships when he composed Philippians it makes the letter even more critical for study and applicable to our lives. Facing hardships aplenty, this tone is yet optimistic, joyful, hopeful, and faithful to God in ways that have moved believers since the beginning of the church.

This summer, a summer unlike most any living person beyond the very oldest has ever faced, we at White Memorial will be preaching through Philippians. We will consider our hardships, challenges, fears, and struggles as we shine the light of scripture upon them. We will find that the words of Philippians provide reliable direction for the practice of faith when hope itself is on the line.

Paul writes, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me," in chapter 4 verse 13. This verse has been made famous for good reason. It is about confidence in the face of despair. It is about strength when we are made to feel weak. It is about the power of faith that God has given us through the one we call Lord. Confidence in God and strength through faith are the spiritual tools we must employ while we pray for doctors and nurses and those who are working hard to use their gifts to protect us.

It turns out that real courage requires belief. Philippians has belief aplenty. Enough to go around and be shared as we pray for a day when our moment is not governed so greatly by our pandemic. We, with belief and courage, are called to pray for a day which will be governed almost completely by the great struggle for redemption and love for which God gave us hearts for faith in the first place.


