I suspect that many people overlook the value of this newsletter. I also suspect you are like me: inundated with news and reminders from businesses, schools, and non-profit organizations. Archived on our web site for as-needed reference, this newsletter is a monthly catalog of ministry at White Memorial. These newsletters are all interesting to me - month after month they are good. But this one, September 2020, is really interesting and really good.

A review of this newsletter leads to an immediate discovery: the ministry of our church is alive, and it is thriving. While nearly all our activities have moved partially or completely online, the ministry pulses on. I find myself sitting in silence, praying the Psalms, and revisiting my sermons from Philippians to make it through a day when I spend a lot of time second-guessing my decisions. But I always end at the same place: difficult or not uncertain or not – the message remains trustworthy and true. The message is about Jesus and God's love. If I refocus myself on the message, the challenges are put into a healthier perspective. A church is all about the message.

On balance, I am incredibly proud of our church staff for transforming our programs and ministries to be accessible from home during these summer months. I applaud our communications folks - Kathy, Karen, Carol, and Parker - who make it seem so easy (it's not). Behind the scenes, Andrew, Colleen, and Tonya have devoted countless hours to making sure our technology will support the delivery of the ministry. Which is, in the end, the delivery of the message. The very same message upon which we stand.

Over the coming weeks, we are going to be sending you many emails, reminders, and requests for your participation. Everyone can use as much contact as possible to the message of Jesus right now, today, and every day. May God bless you richly. I hope to "see" you all soon.






PRESBYTERIAN RUSSIA MISSION NETWORK







FLU SHOTS + BOXED DINNERS TO GO!

Wednesday, September 23 & October 7 Davidson Chapel & Colonial Road

We are offering a flu shot clinic on two different dates this fall. Flu shots will be given by Hayes Barton Pharmacy in the Chapel from 3:00- 6:00 p.m. on Wednesdays, September 23 and October 7. As an added feature our food services director, Macy Aguirre and her staff will be preparing take out meals for those that are missing their Wednesday Together Dinners. Boxed dinners will be available from 4:00-6:00 p.m. (No special orders – all meals will be boxed the same.)

HERE ARE THE DETAILS:

- You will need to register online for your flu shot and for your pickup meal at www.whitememorial.org/register. You do not have to have a flu shot to order a meal, and you don't have to order a meal to receive a flu shot. Prepayment online is required for meals (no refunds). You may call Tonya Higgins at 919-834-3425, ext. 216 to make reservations for flu shots. The deadline for all reservations is 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, September 17 (for the 23rd) and Thursday, October 1 (for the 7th).
- 2. For flu shots and meal pickups masks are required. While on campus please socially distance six feet from others.
- For flu shots park in the Chapel Lots and enter the main Chapel door, bring your insurance card. You must be 14 years old or older to get a flu shot at WMPC.
- Meal pickup will be on Colonial Road. Drive up past the new playground where our side kitchen door is and a volunteer will bring your pre-ordered meals to your vehicle.
