Meekness Reconsidered

I have just returned from a trip to Columbia, SC, where Lucas Jones, a child of WMPC was ordained to pastoral ministry at Downtown Church, a Presbyterian congregation. It was a bright sunny worship service: we preached and prayed outside. I was joined by members of his family and by Nick Demuynck, who was once a youth intern at WMPC. He is now a pastor himself. Lessons learned at White Memorial are being passed on to thousands more through their ministries. It was overwhelming and it was joyful.

The whole experience was a reminder that God is ever faithful. Young adults, like Lucas and Nick, are responding to God's call to serve the church and their neighbors. They are responding to God's call to preach and teach and share the gospel. God continues to provide for the future of the church through their gifts and their voices. And these are only two of many who have been residents at our church, been interns at our church, or have grown up in our church who then felt called to make the decision to practice ministry as a vocation. I will be writing about others in the future. For today let me say that among the most praiseworthy parts of our 75-year history is our development of future pastors.

I thought about the future while driving to Columbia, even while considering the recent past. This month marks one year (hard to believe) since we altered our on-campus operations for COVID safety. In these 12 months, we have marked great successes, learned from a few failures, and adapted nearly every part of our ministry for this trying time of pandemic ministry.

During the ordination service I preached from Psalm 37. Psalm 37 is a psalm, a prayer, a petition for patience and trust. In the first 11 verses there are more than 7 exhortations to trust in God. The psalm says: "Do not fret; trust in the Lord; take delight in the Lord; commit your way to the Lord; be still before the Lord; refrain from anger; and, the meek shall inherit the land." It is a powerful and beautiful reminder of how we are supposed to live as disciples of Jesus; about how we are supposed to regard our relationship to God.

In the sermon I focused on "the meek shall inherit the land." Meekness is often confused with weakness (they even rhyme). But it is not weakness: in the biblical sense, meekness is faithful humility. The meek are those whose faith is in God. The meek are those who do not believe the universe revolves around them. The meek are those who choose the good even when there will be no praise. Meekness, as a theological virtue, is even picked up by Jesus at Matthew 5:5, "blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth."

We do not know what the future will bring – at least not exactly. But our intention for our ministry is to remain faithfully humble. The Bible, and even our Lord, asks for at least so much and certainly for nothing less. So, we will celebrate with young pastors who grew on our campus, and pray that God continues to use us to cultivate more of them. We will mark our first 75 years (beginning this summer) in thanksgiving while asking what is demanded of us to continue to plant more seeds for the decades to come. We will look to mission opportunities, worship opportunities, and reconciling opportunities with an eye and ear to how God is moving in our midst. And we will find strength in the words of scripture like Psalm 37: which calls us to trust in God, just like a newly ordained pastor, no matter the circumstances we shall face.

May faithfulness and humility abound,

THANK YOU, WALTER!





BRIGHT STARS OF BETHLEHEM

"Our aim is that our people, who admire stars, will dare to look up and dream, to believe in goals to strive for and develop a new sense of hope, community, beauty and faith." - Rev. Dr. Mitri Raheb

Bright Stars of Bethlehem, a nonprofit organization that promotes peace and justice in Palestine, was born out of the dream and vision of Rev. Dr. Mitri Reheb who visited with us at WMPC in 2017. In 1995 he began an Outreach Ministry in Bethlehem dedicated to educating the next generation of creative leaders in Palestine. His vision was to support the health, education, cultural and spiritual development of the people in the Middle East in order to promote peace and harmony in the region. He established the International Center of Bethlehem which houses Dar al-Kalima University of Arts & Culture and other initiatives for youth, families, and older adults as well as public advocacy for basic human rights.

Members of our congregation visited the Center in 2009 and 2014 during our trips to Palestine and Israel and were excited to see all that they were doing there. We were treated to an excellent meal created by student chefs in their renowned culinary arts school, one of their many degree programs, which include film production, visual arts, tourism, and graphic design. Over the years WMPC through the Middle East Committee for Peace and Justice has provided scholarship assistance as well as support for a Girls' Soccer Program.

The University accepts Muslims, Christians, Palestinians, people from cities, from villages, and from refugee camps, preparing them for careers. Bright Stars' vision and great hope is for the people of Palestine to have life in abundance.

Hope is what they do!

The Middle East Peace and Justice Committee was formed 11 years ago after the first of two trips (2009 and 2014) members of WMPC have made to Holy Lands. The committee has become the group within our congregation which has focused on interfaith relations in our community and support of mission efforts in Palestine/Israel. Each trip visited Mar Elias schools and the International Center in Bethlehem, where Dar al-Kalima is located.

PILGRIMS OF IBILLIN



VISION: To foster peace and justice in Israel and Palestine through education

Since about 2009, after a trip to Israel by WMPC members, White Memorial has supported an organization called the Pilgrims of Ibillin. Pilgrims of Ibillin was formed about 30 years ago by Rev. Bruce Rigdon from the Presbyterian Church USA and the Grosse Pointe Memorial Presbyterian Church, Michigan, in partnership with Archbishop Elias Chacour from Palestine. Reverend Rigdon and Abuna (Father) Chacour first met each other at a conference in the Middle East. Elias Chacour is an Arab Christian, an orthodox Catholic priest, and a proud Palestinian citizen of Israel. The Gross Pointe community saw this as an opportunity to invest in peace-building in Israel/Palestine.

Pilgrims of Ibillin works to support the Mar Elias Educational Institutions (MEEI) which was founded by Elias Chacour in the tiny town called Ibillin in the northern part of Israel. At MEEI, children from kindergarten through High School study side by side regardless of their religion, family, or background. Children who would normally not spend any time together are invited to become peacemakers as they learn both their school subjects and what it means to be a part of a diverse community.

This partnership of the Pilgrims of Ibillin and Mar Elias Schools Educational Institution has made a difference in the lives of countless children and continues to be a source of hope around the world. Over the years, White Memorial has supported scholarships for students at the MEEI schools, helped finance building projects and renovations at the schools, provided money for computers, and even supported the High School Girls' soccer team! The MEEI students are ranked high in the national exams and MEEI prides itself on giving the children a stellar education.

In addition to the schools, MEEI began to reach out and give annual grants to Peace Building partners organizations.

Pilgrims of Ibillin is a 501 C3 charity.




Contributions in memory of a loved one or in honor of a family member, friend, or member of the church family are welcomed.
