Changes with the Fall

Fall is a time of changes. The schedule changes for most of us. The light in the sky, the position of the sun, moves from the northern sky towards the south. The landscape changes as the leaves fall from the heights to the ground. Cooler mornings start to flirt with the prospect of early frost. October brings with it this amazing liturgical framing, which is in its way another change. The month begins with World Communion Sunday, an international movement and commitment of Christians all over the world to each celebrate the Lord's Supper. The idea of churches of every race and tongue gathering around the bread and the cup is most surely a vision of the kingdom of heaven that Jesus so often uplifts to us from the pages of the New Testament.

October ends with Reformation Sunday. A Sunday when we remember and sing and proclaim the contributions of our branch of the family of faith. Presbyterians, Lutherans, and many others find their origins as churches in the European Reformation of the 16th Century. As we worship on Reformation Sunday I am filled with awe about the faith of our Presbyterian ancestors. Their witness is the origin for so much of what we value. Their witness is the source of so much of what we do even now in the 21st Century.

As the month ends and points toward November, we turn the page to prepare for Advent. We start to focus on the story of Jesus and the journey to Bethlehem of Joseph and Mary. The progression is delightful: from the table of the world, to thanksgiving for our ancestors in faith, to a focus upon the birth of the Messiah. We move from sacrament to theology. We move from theology to hope. Each and every move, each and every hymn, song, and prayer a stepping stone on a liturgical journey.

From time to time, our Session (primarily through the work of our Worship Committee) will approve changes to our church's rhythms. For quite some time now, we have moved our 8:15 service to 8:00 on large attendance Sundays and special music Sundays. **On November 3, 2019 we will permanently move our 8:15 worship service to 8:00 a.m.** This move is made to increase the time our choirs and musicians have to prepare for the next worship service. This move is made to allow for increased parking before the 9:30 worship and Sunday school hour. Our Worship Committee and Session have worked on this for the better part of this year.

In the life of a living institution - which White Memorial surely is - changes come and changes go. Some changes stick. And some are quickly replaced with still other attempts to sharpen our witness. But all we do is to honor God and help the women and men who enter our doors to learn about the ebb and flow of the Christian faith. All we do is done to teach our people to find the stepping stones of faith, on these stones our faith can grow. Faith can and does grow through change upon change. Come what may, we follow the Lord who is ever faithful across every schedule, every landscape, and every tradition, which we carry forward into the future that God is shaping even now.

(which is allocated by our Outreach Committee), 25% is allocated by Mid-Councils
such as presbyteries, and 50% is designated by the Presbyterian Mission Agency
who both engage in peacemaking and build ministries of reconciliation in their
own context or around the world.

Construction Update

October will mark a shift in our construction efforts. As we approach the certificate of occupancy in February, our existing facilities will see the effects of construction and renovation. The creation of the sanctuary bathrooms will begin on October 1. The old robing room will be renovated over the course of several weeks, with the goal of being complete by Thanksgiving – note the word goal. Solar panels will be placed on the Luther and Knox roofs beginning mid-October. Our prior high school room, known as K100, is being prepped to become new outreach space, restrooms, and small dining hall. Pickard is now riddled with barriers, openings, and the signs of encroaching renovations. In the short-term, we will experience space constraints due to these necessary changes. Please be patient as you have to walk further for the restrooms and take alternative routes to access your meeting and worship spaces. In the new facility, many of the changes during the month of October will be invisible. Information technology, fire monitoring, security, audio visual infrastructure, and all of the other systems that make a worship-dining-meeting facility work will be installed and tied to the rest of campus this month. Your staff has been training for the better part of a year to adapt to these new systems. We are quickly approaching the opening of the new facility, tours and opportunities to see for yourself are on the horizon.

CHAIR YOGA




GENTLE YOGA






TAI CHI MEANS MOVING MEDITATION

These boxes are handcrafted in two villages: Palekh and Fedoskino, in central Russia, and decorated with intricate miniatures often filled with symbolism. This combines elements of Russian icon painting with a variety of subjects from Russian legends, fairy-tales and important historical events. Box prices depend on the picture's size, usually starting at \$200.


