Of course, confidence is what you have before you understand the problem and we are learning all the time! The project is going great. We have started to take tours with many of you and cannot wait to take more during this month. THANK YOU to everyone who gave to the Imagine Campaign to make it possible.

Stephen Ministry at White Memorial celebrates 30 years of ministry on November 17. If you do not know, Stephen Ministry is a ministry of compassion where trusted and trained lay persons listen and pray with those who would otherwise feel alone. White Memorial engaged in this ministry in 1989, only 14 years after the organization was founded. Thank you to everyone who served over these past 30 years.

During September and October we heard our mission partners share their work with us and we heard the ways our generosity changes the lives of those inside the church and around the world. Through dedication Sunday we received 520 pledges accounting for \$2.6 million. We are so close to our goal! Thank you so much for making White Memorial the kind of church where your staff and leadership are honored to serve. We are so proud of your sacrificial giving that ensures our children know that God loves them, cares for every member and non-member who enters our doors, and sends assistance back out into the world. THANK YOU!

We will get to say thanks when we celebrate with our neighborhood churches at St. John's Baptist Church on November 24 at 5:30 p.m. We will gather with our Oberlin Road community for worship and fellowship after the service. That morning, we will celebrate Christ the King Sunday. During worship, we will celebrate the Lordship of Christ and close our Christian year. We will pray together, "Blessed be the Lord God of Israel, for he has looked favorably on his people and redeemed them." During this time of worship we will prepare for Advent. After all, our expectation is for a king.

CHAIR YOGA





Affordable and Transitional Housing

IN 2019, WMPC PROVIDED \$43,000.00 THROUGH BUDGETED FUNDS AND COMMUNITY GRANTS TO THESE AGENCIES TO MEET THE NEED:

Habitat for Humanity Wake County-Habitat provides no-interest loans for homes for qualifying families. Families put in sweat equity hours in building their own house and helping on other projects. Each family is provided instruction in home ownership and has someone who works with them in the process of picking out home features to give it a personal touch. For many families this is the only way they would be able to own their own home. Habitat Wake also builds houses in Cambodia, Honduras, and Malawi, so they help provide houses locally and internationally. Visit them at www.habitatwake.org.

Healing Transitions for Men and Women—These centers for men and women are all about freedom and dignity. Freedom from addiction through long-term recovery, and dignity through a non-medical detox, aovernight emergency shelter and longer term housing if they become part of the program. 


