## Lent: A Season of Transition

Lent is a time of transitions. We move from Epiphany to Easter. We move from considering the righteousness of God to considering the very real shortcomings of human beings. We move from considering our own mortality to the promise of salvation. We move from understanding the injustice in our world to understanding the justice which God desires. While Lent may find few who label it a “favorite” time of the Christian year, it ranks among the most critical and deep of all Christian experiences. There is a beauty in the honesty that Lent requires: our sin and God’s glory. We are dust, and to dust we shall return. All our hopes are thrown upon the mercy of Jesus.

In the life of White Memorial, there are also transitions in our midst. I ask for your prayers for three different transition points. After a one year hiatus, our pastoral resident program returns this year. Under the leadership of Associate Pastor for Pastoral Care Cate Church Norman and Elder Eddie Williford, our search committee is hard at work interviewing candidates. Please pray for them as they consider candidates and identify a new resident pastor to join our staff this summer. Our pastoral residency program not only benefits White Memorial but is a pastoral leadership development program for the greater church. Our past pastoral residents serve in communities from Oregon to Charlotte. They are leaders, prayed over and trained at White Memorial. We hope that very soon we will have a pastoral resident for 2020-2022 and continue our ministry of preparation for the greater church.

During March a search committee for a new Associate Director for Music will also begin. Like liturgy, prayer, and preaching, the offering of music through the singing of songs and hymns stands near the core of Christian Worship. In the past five years, we have grown every musical ministry of our church. Our Youth Choir, our OnPoint House Band, our Youth Band, our children’s choirs, and our adult choirs have all grown. We enjoy a wonderful concert series, called *Sounds on Oberlin*, which touches hundreds of souls every year with the wonder of beautiful music. Please pray for our search committee as they search nationally and locally for a new person to join our staff in the critical role of leading music for our OnPoint@1704 services, our Youth Band, and the greater ministry of music for our church family.

And, we will soon inform the congregation of our plans to cover Christian Education and Faith Formation. Since our Associate Pastor for Faith Formation accepted a call in a new congregation, we have been praying about how best to address the staff leadership and support of children’s and adult Christian Education. We will announce in April our plans to support this critical function of our common church life together. We Presbyterians have always championed Christian Education. We hope to continue this commitment well into the future as we assess both the needs and the resources of our congregation.

Finally, we continue to transition into new spaces for ministry on our campus. Let me thank you again for your historic support of the Imagine Campaign which has already provided our new Edinburgh Building and its new kitchen spaces for meals, fellowship, and worship. Our renovations of the old kitchen, Geneva Hall, and Pickard Hall continue through June. By midsummer, all the work should be complete. We thank you for your patience as the construction has made access to our facility, parking, and other parts of our church’s life a real challenge. I want to thank you, our members and friends, for your spirit of endurance. Our five-year plan is being realized as new and renovated buildings come online. I also want to thank our staff for their efforts to continue our ministry in the midst of great transitions of space and construction. They have managed to assess and overcome many obstacles. We are closing in on completion of the great work we began when we imagined an invigorated church campus to serve our members, friends, and our entire community.

We are moved into Edinburgh! Our first worship service will be on March 8. Access to the new building will be through the second floor of Luther, off of Oberlin Road through the new courtyard, and through the K100 entrance off McDonald Lane through the new Small Dining space (K100). When renovations are complete, access will resume through the Connector, Geneva Hall, and Pickard. Asbestos abatement is underway in Geneva and is contained, constantly being monitors to ensure safety. Pickard Hall is currently gutted, making way for new flooring, ceilings, paint, and fixtures. The renovation project is scheduled to complete by the end of June.

In one of the orphanages (for children with bad vision) we added knitted hats and scarves, made by the members of your church. It was so touching, the children, who could not see well, could feel the warmth of these knitted hats and feel your kindness and care.

Every year we have a short winter camp for youth. This year was not an exception. From the 1st till the 3rd of January about 40 young people had fellowship, studied Bible together, sang songs, played in the forest. The camp program had a very serious spiritual part. And it was useful for them.

Thank you for taking part in this ministry. We appreciate your part very much!

We are looking forward to spending time with the team from your church in May. We hope to have great time together.

We thank God for the partnership that we have and for all the years that we can serve our Lord together.






